## Thoughts from Fr. Sean



There are two great commandments: Love God; Love your neighbor. We all know these words by heart—albeit different iterations may apply—and we do a fairly good job at implementing the commandments in our lives. There are always opportunities to expand that implementation, however, and I'd like to discuss two of them with you.

The first is Family Promise. I have a confession to make: I have not been as vocal about Family Promise in these last months as I should have been. I realize that—although I am dedicated to this ministry—if I don't exude the energy and compassion externally that I feel inwardly, I am not creating a loving example of 'love thy neighbor'. I want this program to succeed, simply because of that purpose for which it was created. As Christians, we are called to feed the hungry, clothe the naked, friend the lonely, heal the sick, and proclaim by word and example the good news of Jesus Christ. Family Promise encompasses all of these life changing behaviors. Through it churches have the opportunity to house the homeless; give them food; create a sense of hope and love; give their children a chance at a safer life; all while acting as the hands and feet of Jesus Christ. Please join me, the deacons, Jen Peterson and many others who have pledged themselves to this worthy cause. Try and find some time during the week—one or two hours of one day—to spend with these people, your neighbors, in terms of feeding or fellowship. Together we can begin to disfigure the face of hopelessness and change it into a visage of joy and love.

The second is the global wave of prayer initiative which spans from the 25<sup>th</sup> of May through June 4<sup>th</sup>. Archbishop Justin Welby has invited the Christian world to join him in global prayer for all people, everywhere. In his video, Welby states that he experienced Jesus Christ over 42 years ago and since that time, Christ has walked alongside him in moments of joy and sorrow, in times of want and need, and even in instances where Justin didn't want him...Jesus was still there. I think we have all experienced the peaks and valleys of faith—those places where we meet the living, life-giving Lord that heals our wounds and gives us hope for present circumstances and future situations; just as we have shied away from Jesus in particularly difficult moments when we have felt unworthy or ashamed. In both cases, Jesus Christ has walked alongside us, too. It is precisely this reason that Welby asks us to pray for the world. He is interested in the global Jesus Movement, an initiative to bring others into this walk with Christ and to seek a few moments in prayer every day for our neighbors everywhere to experience the power and love of God. I hope you will visit www.thykingdomcome.global and pledge yourself to this worthy cause; by

signing up you will create a light on a virtual map of our area, but more importantly you will be acting as an emissary of the Holy Spirit, breathing life into others around you.
