WE'RE LAUNCHING OUR NEW WEBSITE!

The St. Luke's website has a new look! It's been completely remodeled with more visuals, more news and more information about how prospective members can become part of the St. Luke's family. With the help of Sandy Lee, our hardworking webmaster for nearly a decade, the site has now become the responsibility of Dan Droege of the vestry communications committee. The web address remains the same: <u>episcopalbartlesville.org</u>.



While there is much about our faith that remains the same, there is also much about parish life that keeps evolving and changing. For example, at the 10:30 Holy Eucharist we had the opportunity to bid farewell to Jo Oertle, a longtime member of St. Luke's, who will be moving to be near family in New Hampshire in August. In the same service there happened to be

a visitor who told me he was looking for a church home. Then he said, "I think I just found one." Over my almost twenty years as Rector I have had to say "goodbye" as well as "hello" to a lot of people.

Churches evolve in a variety of ways – usually for the better. In the early days of my tenure we developed a folder for visitors and new members. The multicolored and sized pages described our parish life. There was a lot of information to help people learn about us and perhaps decide to join our church. I think it was fairly well done, attractive and informative.

The use of computers and the internet was on the rise. Initially only a few people had email, but that changed quickly – though there were a few holdouts. Before long we recognized the need for our parish to have a website - that was about ten years ago. The diocese was encouraging churches to develop websites and provide workshops which some of us attended.

Enter Sandy Lee – another longtime member who was teaching computer technology at Tri-County. She had also created several websites for organizations in the community. She offered to create one for St. Luke's. She had the knowledge and experience to go out on the internet and find programs to create our website at no cost – it was all free. I remember how excited we were when we "launched" our website.

For about eight or nine years now Sandy has faithfully maintained our website - again, at no cost. She has kept things updated, which is a weekly process. This included "The Steeple" and the sermon for the week. Plus, she posted all the updates for events in the parish as well as pictures from time to time. I am so grateful for all Sandy has done for us over these years. She has made a difference in presenting our parish life to the public. Indeed, we rarely have a visitor who has not already "visited" us online.

Now the time has come to create a new website for St. Luke's. This was approved by the Vestry several months ago and Dan Droege has taken the lead. After all the years of maintaining our current website, Sandy has agreed that it is time for a change and is being very supportive. Again, we are grateful for all Sandy has done – we could not have done it without her.

That being so, Dan has been working with a local company called "Bit Brilliant, LLC" to build a new and expanded website. I think everyone will be pleased. The Wardens and I have approved the new version and it has been reviewed by members of the Vestry. The official launch will be the end of this week at the same link: www.episcopalbartlesville.org.

And so, we continue evolving into a new era of presenting St. Luke's and communication within the church and the community. St. Luke's is a church on the move "With Arms Wide Open."
