# ... DEACON DAYDREAMS ...

Easter Monday. I guess that is what this day is. Monday after Easter sounds too mundane for this day. Easter Monday--a day for reflecting and gathering thoughts and emotions from the week before. I wonder what your moments were this last week?

Maundy Thursday was memorable from start to finish. The Seder Supper was especially moving, but my perspective was enhanced by watching three adorable little boys really enjoy the whole feast, from start to finish. Their furtive nibbles on the matzah and the egg, the irresistible drinks of the grape juice, the hiding and revealing of the leavened cracker, and their joy when dinner really started--it was all to be watched and enjoyed. The service, washing of the feet and all, left me feeling that a very dark night had come, but with the assurance that love would light the way. Sean's sermon on departures touched my heart, and made me think about departures in my own life, and the ones that would come soon enough. Jesus shows us how to manage the grief in our life.

Good Friday brought many people to walk the Stations of the Cross. How can Jesus still call us friend? And yet he does, and we are. Good Friday brought quiet prayers into the chapel, people slipping in and out of the church silently, and a muted service in a bare and strange nave. I wonder how our services would look if we took away the lovely worship icons? What if there were no linen, no banners, no cross, no cushions for our old knees? Would we draw closer? Would we pray less?

The Great Easter Vigil on Saturday night was all that was promised, and more. From the moment Fr. Sean began to chant, through Kate's and Carol's lovely readings, formed by the musical interludes--the Holy Spirit came and settled in for the evening. I was sitting quietly on the deacon's bench when a sudden thought hit me--I was totally at peace, totally immersed in the love emanating from this place. What a joy!

Easter morning brought with it the unique chill of a March morning in Oklahoma and the promise of rain most of the day. The weather could not dampen the Easter mood inside this church, and people came whom we had not seen in a long time, or had never seen. Fr. Lee spoke movingly about Judas and us, about being in God's grace no matter the wine spills or the messy lives that we live. I could hear Jesus calling and forgiving Judas and me in the same breath, letting us see his risen self. The lilies, the incense, the music (oh the music!!!), the words, the whole morning exuded joy and grace! Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia.

Easter continues. Life continues. Poverty continues. We, the Easter people, now have the chance to step out in our grace-filled life and give back to our brothers and sisters in need. Family Promise is two weeks away and we are, each one of us, needed. Please step forward and be a part of this small way to make life a little more manageable for those who struggle so much. If you can contribute food, do so. If you can spend an hour or so, do so. If you can give up a night in your own bed, do so. If you have extra dollars, please give them. If you have any extra hours, they are needed. We will support you and help you do what is out of your comfort zone. We need you--all of you.

May this wonderful Easter season be a time of joy and grace, love and inclusion, healing and inspiration for you. May you see Jesus in a new way. May God's blessings rest abundantly on you and yours.

The purpose of the Kairos program is to establish a Christian community inside prisons by the transforming love and forgiveness of Jesus Christ. Our sexton, Lana Lookout, will be participating as a volunteer on a Kairos Weekend team at the Mabel Bassett Correctional Center for women on April 14-17. We are very excited for her to have this opportunity and would like to support her. **One of the ways to support a Kairos Weekend is with cookies!** 5,000 dozen to be exact! These cookies are distributed to everyone at the prison as tangible evidence of unconditional love for the residents. **IMPORTANT:** You must use ONLY the approved cookie recipes provided. Specific recipes and directions are available on the church bulletin board or you may go to <http://kairosoklahoma.org/youcan.html> to download the recipes. Cookies may be brought to the church and placed in the upright freezer on the NW end of Metcalf Hall. Cookies must be brought to the church no later than Tuesday, April 12. ## DISCIPLESHIP FORUM and TUESDAY SPIRITUAL DISCIPLINE GROUP New Study Begins Sun., April 3 & Tues., April 5

Our Lenten Study of The 3 Colors of Your Spirituality was wonderful and the response from our four groups very positive. Christian Schwarz's book has been informative, enlightening and affirming. He provides a unique way of understanding nine different spirituality styles for approaching our relationship with God and growing spiritually. His language, imagery and typology give us very useful ways for talking about ourselves and understanding others.

Thus, the study has been very helpful – but what now? We need to take this to the next level and apply what we have learned to our personal lives. This can be done through what is called "28 Days of Discipline." By signing up online at [www.3colorsofyourspirituality.org](http://www.3colorsofyourspirituality.org), participants can receive six daily disciplines each week regarding your "native style" plus one day each week receive a more challenging discipline. Participants are encouraged to keep a journal which will help in tracking their personal growth.

Anyone can do this on his or her own (and it is free). However, starting the Sunday after Easter and during the Easter Season, we are planning to use this method in Sunday's Discipleship Forum and the Tuesday Spiritual Discipline Group. Everyone is welcome to join either of these groups and be a part of the process. If there is an interest in yet another group being formed, Fr. Lee will help make those arrangements. If you are just starting to read The 3 Colors of Your Spirituality, give him a call and let him help – there is plenty of time to get on board.
