Deacon Doug's Tenth Anniversary – The timing could not have been better to have Deacon Doug preaching last Sunday – it wasn't planned that way. It just happened and I am pleased. What a joy to share the journey at St. Luke's with Doug Freebern. I can't believe it has been ten years **Rector** since his ordination – and that does not count the four or

five years of discernment and training in preparation for that sacrament. He has always been eager to serve in any way I have asked – providing pastoral care for members, of course assisting at the Altar, reading the Gospel, helping with the Holy Eucharist at Green Country, supplying at St. Paul's in Claremore and St. Thomas in Pawhuska, nurturing curates, and much more. Deacon Doug is a Prism of Christ and Christ's ministry for our parish and the community.

The Ups and Downs of Family Promise – Quite honestly there are both ups and downs. That is the risk of doing ministry of any kind including helping homeless families. Applicants for the program go through a screening process to determine as best as possible if the family is ready for Family Promise. People who are not ready are referred to other programs for assistance – no one is simply turned away. Ashley Sikes, the director, is very good at steering families toward other resources.

This time we had three homeless families as our guests. In fact they were the same as the last time we were Family Promise hosts. Two of the families had made a lot of progress while one had not. As a result it was determined that the one family could no longer be in the program and had to be released. That was regrettable but necessary. Meanwhile, one family graduated from the program and is now in an apartment. The other will graduate this week when their apartment is ready. The parents are beaming and the children are excited. This is another big success for them. They will continue to receive support and encouragement from the Family Promise program for many months, but this a huge milestone in their journey. (We gave both families grocery gift cards as graduation presents from St. Luke's.)

As before, our people stepped up and filled every volunteer spot to make this another good week. Being hosts is not only a ministry to these families, but also a learning experience for us. Getting to know the parents and children gives us some insight to what life is like for them. As we learn from Bridges of Out of Poverty, these homeless families live with the "tyranny of every day" just trying to survive. And, they come in the program with stories of where they have been, but most often have no "future story." Our primary role is to host them "with arms wide open" – as friends in Christ.

Regarding the Fire Codes – Many people have asked what has happened with the fire codes and the legislative exemption. Everything has been approved and signed. Without going into the details, the exemption allows families to stay overnight in the church and as well as similar activities like youth lock-ins and mission teams. In addition, smoke detectors "hardwired" into the electrical system are required in the areas were people are sleeping. The change is minimal, but makes everyone happy. The law will take effect in November and will require approval of the City Council, which is already supportive. Now more churches will be added and the rotation will not be as frequent.
