UTO INGATHERING **SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 13**

United Thank Offering Ingathering is Sunday, November 13. As you count your

blessing each day, save a coin or two in a designated spot, and then bring your offering to church on Nov. 13. Monies collected here will be combined with other parishes across the U.S. and then given as grants to support mission & ministry needs here and abroad. UTO Blue Boxes & envelopes are available in the Narthex and church office.



Examples of Grant Awards for 2016 include:

\$44,526 granted to Diocese of Delaware with the Companion Diocese of the Dominican Republic to install a solar power system on the Episcopal Church property in Jalonga, which will also generate electricity for a water well. It will provide consistent electricity for the church, community center and bakery and bring relief to the children & families at the Early Learning Program in the church school.

Also \$39,162 granted to the Diocese of Indianapolis for St. Nicholas' Natural Playground & Environmental Education Project to provide grading, landscaping, drainage, fencing and playground equipment for infants and toddlers in an urban setting. Educational opportunities offered through the playground and its gardens will provide fresh produce and take-home kits to use with children.

From the Rector...



The week of November 13 will start a new experience in the Sunday Discipleship Forum and Tuesday Spiritual Discipline Group using Richard Rohr's <u>The Naked Now – Learning to</u> See as the Mystics See. Notice I said "experience" and not "study." Yes, reading is involved and No, becoming a mystic isn't the point – something not just different, but more.

In my journey through college (four years into six), my three seminary years for a Master of Divinity and then my Doctor of Ministry in four years of combined pastoral ministry and seminary, I loved books. Bible commentaries and dictionaries were prizes for me along with books on the original languages of Hebrew and Greek. I also love systematic theology and book after book was added to my collection. I was eager to learn and grow in my knowledge of the Christian faith, history and Bible. All the while I was increasingly immersed in on the job training about church life in terms of pastoral care, preaching and prayer as well as administration and leadership – well beyond seminary.

As I look at my personal library in the office, I am aware I cannot bring all of it home and expect to put it all on display again. Indeed, most of the books referenced above have little meaning to me now – though I value what I learned from them. Even before I moved beyond my "previous life" I began to collect a different kind of writings – spirituality, social justice, parables, saints, liturgy, meditations and more. I suspect these are the books I will mostly likely keep because they are the ones that helped me grow beyond my head and more in my heart and spirit. Indeed, they led me beyond knowledge to experience.

I think one of the reasons Paul Young's book, <u>The Shack</u>, became so popular is because it stirred something in the souls of many readers. We experienced something of God that was fresh, challenging, personal and redeeming – even transformative with each reading.

In recent years I have come to the point of reading more for experience than knowledge. Sure, learning is still important. However, "experiences" of God personally, in others and through resources can truly transform us from the inside out little by little – there are no shortcuts.

This narrative is intended as a reflection on my journey, but more importantly to be an invitation to join in new experiences of God and way of life offered in <u>The Naked Now</u>. There are three parts to the book and I plan on two sessions for each part – participants should plan on reading each part at least twice. This six week series will lead us through Advent.

Here is a description of Rohr's book: "The enlightenment you seek in other religions has been present in Christianity from the beginning. Richard Rohr, a global leader in spiritual awakening, helps you recognize the forces (such as ego resistance and dual thinking) that separate you from your deeper self. Then drawing from the Gospels and the greatest Christian contemplatives, he show you what it means to be spiritually awake."

<u>The Naked Now, Learning to See as the Mystics See</u>, was one of the resources I used on my recent retreat. This was a marvelous experience and resource I want to share with others. Come, let us journey together for six weeks and beyond.


Door News The South Entry Doors are being finished (as in painted and varnished) this week—weather permitting, of course.
