Thoughts from Fr. Sean



As I walked through the halls of the hospital, I nodded a smile to passersby and spoke a gentle, "How you doin'?" As I walked on by, I realized that I, and many of us, do this as an automatic response to people we don't even know. It's not that we're uncaring, or even that we're that disconnected; I believe that we actually do care for the well-being of

those around us, even those people we don't know. Yet we speak words without expectation of hearing the response. What if, by saying 'How you doin?' and not waiting for the response, we're disallowing an open ear to the response? Or, better yet, what if by saying the line we are just repeating a pleasantry without meaning?

This has me thinking of the words, "Happy Holy Week." What does that even mean? I've run into multiple people these last few days and I've said those words to virtually everyone with whom I've come into contact. But now, midweek, I'm stopping to listen to the response. Happy Holy Week means more to me than just a simple pleasantry; it means, "Hey, the celebration of our risen Lord is coming up, isn't that GREAT?" This week can be busy. It can wrap us up in the 'doings' and extensive work and planning of what is undoubtedly the highest liturgical week of the year. As I said last Sunday, I don't want that to take the place of the insurmountable joy within me when I think about Holy Week and all that it actually means.

So to you I say this: Happy Holy Week; I hope your days have been a constant reminder that Jesus Christ loves you, and proved it through the ultimate sacrifice, through the breaking of the bread, and through sending you His Spirit that you may share it with all around you. And not just as a pleasantry, but as a way to share the life-giving love of God. Happy Holy Week to you all.

I'm looking forward to celebrating the conqueror of death, the giver of life, and the risen Lord Jesus Christ with you, now, and in the weeks and months to come.
