ALL SAINT'S SUNDAY

Sunday, November 5th will be All Saint's Sunday. If you have a loved one who has passed away and would like their name read at the service please call the church office at 918-336-1212 or email office@episcopalbartlesville.org so we can add them to the list.

As a "cradle Episcopalian" who cut my teeth (literally!) on the 1928 Book of Common Prayer and the 1940 Hymnal I grew up believing that you must sing *The Doxology* when the ushers carried the offering plates to the altar or else God probably wouldn't consider your offerings legitimate! I wasn't sure what the word *doxology* meant but I really liked saying it and the only tune we ever used was *The Old 100th* so I figured it must be good if it was so old! That was in the early 1940's & 50's. As I grew older and began trying to learn more about this business called *liturgy* I came to understand it's not so much what we sing or say that makes our gifts acceptable to God but the intention, the spirit-awareness of why we offer any gifts to God. Maturity deepened my understanding that gifts are so much more than material things. God gifts us with talents, special abilities, and heart-felt yearnings to share and to care for one another. We offer so much more when the ushers carry the offering plates filled with our monetary gifts to the altar. We are also lifting our hearts in thanksgiving for all gifts bestowed on us by this Creator of all good gifts! And singing *Praise God from whom ALL blessings flow* takes on deeper meaning!

We will sing *The Doxology* (see Hymn 380, vs. 3) during the Sundays in November as a special reminder to be especially aware of God's many blessings in our lives. You might also note the text for *Praise God from whom...* is found as the last verse of Hymn 11. The tune is not the familiar *Old 100th*.

Another reminder about great hymns of thanksgiving: the *Sanctus* is considered a great hymn of thanksgiving and we sing, or say, this hymn at each Eucharist.

DEACON'S DIALOGUE:

"We live in a broken world"...Bishop Ed began his homily for the opening Eucharist for the National Cursillo Conference this past weekend. And the hush in the congregation at the Cathedral became even more pronounced.

That congregation was composed of about 100 people from across the country. I talked with conference delegates from Missouri, Chicago, Texas, South Florida, and California. We had come together to try to advance the goal of the Cursillo ministry, which is to empower lay leaders and bring Christ into the lives of all people. Bishop Ed's message continued with a moving plea to all that they should renew themselves in the Christian movement to become disciples and apostles of Christ; even in the face of apathy and of adversity.

The conference employed a symbol to represent emergence from brokenness. This symbol used was the St. Paul's Cathedral cross that was shattered at 9:02 AM April 19, 1995. The broken pieces were recovered to be embedded in the cathedral reconstruction and now stand as a reminder that fragments in the world can also be brought back together.

Becky Liehr presented a workshop on the shortened weekend. Ellen Heald seemed to be everywhere doing support work. Fr. Lee was the keynote speaker on Friday evening.

Canon Bill Carroll presented one of the workshops. Its topic was the *Jesus Movement*. Since Michael Currey became our presiding bishop we've been hearing the term often. Canon Bill brought many points to the presentation; too many to adequately speak to here. He pointed out that this is not a new concept. It is simply the Christianity of the New Testament. It is *The Way* as practiced in the years following the Resurrection.

The conference delegate from Texas announced that the 2018 Cursillo Conference will be held in Houston. He reiterated that the city will absolutely be ready to be a gracious host. Next year's theme will try to extend this year's "*Take up your cross and go*" by asking "Go Where?". **And that is a question we should each be asking ourselves, "Where can I take the Christ-image and message in my every-day life?"**

HELPING WITH PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION



Have you seen our church van all over the place recently? We are participating actively in keeping the Washington County Transportation Coalition up and running. 2 days a week, our van becomes a city bus, driven by members of our parish. On a scheduled route, the van picks up around 20 or more people a day and gets them where they need to be--from the Lighthouse

to Wal-Mart, from the library to Social Security office, from Mary Martha to Agape. Our fellow citizens who are lacking in any transportation are given reliable and free rides on our sweet van. Sometimes our van fills in for the other vans that are being used. Usually you will see Mike, Jeff, Steve, or Brian driving on Wednesday or Thursday. Occasionally you might see someone else at a different time driving about. We are stepping up to fill in a gap. This is temporary! Please urge your city council members to do what they are considering, and find the funding source. The city bus needs to be funded on a permanent, public-supported basis. Please call the council members, including the mayor, and express your support for the funding of this important piece of the puzzle.
