So how are your star words appearing in your daily life? Remember those stars? You received one on Epiphany. For those of you starting to feel left out, there are still stars available in the office. Just pick one out of the bag and NOTICE. Be mindful of how that word pops

up, what does it mean to you, how often are you noticing your word?

My word is "praise." I wasn't too thrilled with it, thinking it was kind of an ordinary star word. I have certainly noticed it so many places. Mostly, what I have been struck by is a growing personal conviction that I need to praise in place of fixing, suggesting, teaching, clarifying, criticizing, or questioning. I'm still on a steep learning and awareness curve, but I'm trying. When I see someone doing something that isn't quite what I think it should be, I stop myself from fixing it right. Instead, I say a quiet prayer of gratitude for that person, and turn to do something else. I'm trying to watch my eternal need to suggest an improvement. Instead, I'm trying to give honest praise and recognition to the people who are doing so much around me. And I'm trying not to ask God for so much, turning my prayer time to praise time and finding myself more grateful for what is right in my life. I have a long way to go. I am surprised at how hard this "ordinary" word is. I'm embarrassed, actually, at my stress over giving praise instead of criticism. This star has certainly lit up a few dusty corners in my soul.

CONCERN



Some of you may have heard rumors about the CONCERN Child Learning Center so I want to tell you what is happening. It's exciting news! About 50 years ago, St. Luke's and a number of other churches formed Churches United for Community Concern (CONCERN) which established a Child Learning Center. At that time, no childcare facility in Bartlesville:

- accepted a child of color,
- was located on the westside, or
- offered quality and affordable childcare for low-income working parents.

The CONCERN Child Learning Center (CCLC) was started to meet these 3 needs. Tuition became affordable thanks to subsidies from CONCERN and tuition support from the Government's Department of Human Services (DHS).

CONCERN constructed the CCLC building in the 1970's for an enrollment of 90 children. Changing regulations over the years now limit our enrollment to 58 which has decreased our income. In addition, a few years ago DHS put a freeze on accepting new families into their program, so when children graduate from the CCLC, there are fewer who qualify to receive DHS funds to fill the vacancies. Throughout these changes, CONCERN's commitment has never waived even as the subsidies paid to the CCLC first doubled and then tripled. We finally had to accept that this level of support is no longer possible.

We looked for a partner who could continue to provide affordable, quality childcare and that partner is Washington County Childcare Foundation. We are so happy that the CCLC will become part of the existing network of Delaware childcare facilities and have the financial backing to keep it going. The transition will be seamless to the children and parents. The location and directors will remain the same and the staff will have the option to stay on and receive a much-needed pay increase.

So... after the contracts are executed and we have said a prayer of thanksgiving, CONCERN will be able to re-focus our mission by increasing the help we give to those who are homeless, those who might lose their electricity, gas, or water, and those who need an Oklahoma Identification card or prescriptions. CONCERN's emergency pantry will continue to serve those who are in critical need of food. The need today is as prevalent as ever – in fact Salvation Army turned away 226 people who needed help in January alone.

St. Luke's ALSO depends on CONCERN. When Father Steve gets a call or someone stops by the church who needs help, they are referred to CONCERN who provides financial and nutritional needs. As importantly, the CONCERN staff and volunteers are experienced in dealing with people who are emotional, angry or without hope. The staff does what they can to help their clients while treating them with dignity and respect and are the light of Christ for these people.

CONCERN and our community still need your money, time, hearts, hands, and donations to the pantry, and St. Luke's will certainly continue to support CONCERN through the Outreach funds.

We are so happy that our prayers have been answered and we found a solution that continues the promise of quality care and education for the children while being able to help more of the people in need.

LITERACY

The homily on Sunday (Feb 10) mentioned the high percentage of adults in Oklahoma that do not have functional literacy. 23% of adults over 18 cannot read well enough to fill out a job application, do necessary paperwork on the job, read prescription labels accurately, or understand community signage. Such a high illiteracy rate has ramifications in all areas of life, including employment, poverty, incarceration, drug use, child rearing, health decisions, and feeling successful.

The library provides free, confidential, personalized, one-to-one learning opportunities to adults who inquire about reading. Tutors are always needed! The library provides the training and asks you to make a one-year commitment. Please pick up a brochure from the bulletin board next to Metcalf and/or go to the library to volunteer your services.
