Over the years I have heard church folk talking about a priest or minister as being "gifted". "He has so many gifts for ministry" or "she is a gifted speaker, or musician, or counselor" or "he has the gift of leadership." From 2005-2007, I worked on a staff of five priests (and two retired bishops) at St. James Church in Baton Rouge, and I was always impressed with the professionalism and various strengths and weaknesses of the clergy on full display. Thankfully, our diocese is filled with many gifted and talented clergy, and it is a blast to serve among so many wonderful people.

So, it's important to remember why pastors and priests have been given gifts for ministry. We have received these gifts not for ourselves, not for our own enjoyment and not so that we can be praised and lauded for having these gifts or to be used to further our careers. We have received these gifts for the benefit of the church, for serving God by serving the world, for preaching and teaching, for spreading the Good News of Christ to the world in the places where God has called us.

The same is true for the laity of the church. You have received your gifts not for yourselves, not for your own enjoyment and not so that you can be praised and lauded for your gifts. You have received these gifts for the benefit of the church and the world, for serving God by serving others, for sharing and spreading the Good News of Christ to the world.

I hope you will take some time this week to think about your gifts. What gift has God given you that you can give away to further the work of God's kingdom? Is there something you have been holding back or "hiding under a bushel" that can help others to experience and know the love of God? If you aren't sure what your gifts are and would like to go a little deeper, I'm available to share some tools with you to help you discover your gifts for ministry.

New Rector at St. Andrew's, Lawton

The Wardens, Vestry and people of St. Andrews Episcopal Church, Lawton, Oklahoma, are proud and excited to announce that the Reverend Stephanie Jenkins has accepted the call to become our next rector. Bishop Konieczny has consented to the call and Reverend Stephanie will begin her ministry at St. Andrew's on November 1, 2019.

Reverend Stephanie's roots in southwest Oklahoma grow deep. A native of Duncan, Oklahoma, she was an All-State Basketball player at Duncan High School and later attended college at the University of Oklahoma, where she majored in sociology and from which she received her Bachelor of Arts degree in 1999. Following graduation from OU, Reverend Stephanie served as a Peace Corps

volunteer in Zambia before returning to her hometown as Executive Director of the Chisholm Trail Art Council. In 2007 she began studies at the Episcopal Divinity School in Cambridge, Massachusetts from which she was awarded her Masters of Divinity in 2010. She was ordained to the priesthood in July of 2010.

Following her ordination, Reverend Stephanie accepted a position as curate at St. Luke's Episcopal Church in Bartlesville, Oklahoma, eventually serving as Priest-in-Charge during the regular priest's extended absence due to illness. Since her time at St. Luke's, she has served as Assistant Priest at St. Peter's Episcopal Church in Weston, Massachusetts, Campus Missioner for the Diocese of Kansas to colleges and universities across the diocese, and as Chaplain and Teacher at Bishop Seabury Academy in Lawrence, Kansas.

Reverend Stephanie is married to Richard Jenkins, a cartoonist, educator, and author. They are proud parents of two children, Henry (7) and Cora (5).


