An excerpt from Father Steve's St. Luke's Day sermon:

In today's Gospel lesson (Luke 4:14-21), Jesus shows clearly that he knows who he is and where he is going. It is an awareness that has come to him through serious study of the scriptures, deep and impassioned prayer and a commitment to living within the community of God's faithful people.

We are called today to follow Jesus in this ministry. We are called to study the scriptures, pray hard and long for guidance, to live out a commitment to the gathered people of God by coming together in worship and prayer and service.

When I was called here, one of the things that impressed me about St. Luke's is the notion that everyone is involved in at least one ministry—that there is an understanding that we are a people that serve. I haven't said anything specifically about this idea that we all are all expected to serve in at least one ministry—either in the church or in the world—because I assumed it wasn't something that needed to be said. Yet, I find myself this morning wanting to reinforce this notion in case I haven't been explicit enough in the previous 106 weeks that I have been your rector.

Our call to serve is rooted in Jesus' call to serve. If Jesus had been called to sit around all day, that would be our focus; but he was called to serve, to call people to action, to give hope to the hopeless, to offer healing and wholeness and an opportunity for new life in a sinful and broken world.

We are not called to serve in order to earn our salvation; we serve in response to our salvation—in response to the love of God as revealed to us in the person of Jesus of Nazareth.

And we are called to follow the Spirit's leading in serving the world in Jesus' name.
