

Mealtime prayers

Tracy and I were eating at Chuy's in Tulsa last week. I could go on about how much I love the food there, but one thing that stuck out to me on this particular visit was the wax paper wrapper used to protect the clean silverware. On the wrappers are printed three prayers or blessings to pray before your meal -- one Protestant, one Jewish, and one Roman Catholic. These prayers have been printed on the wrapper for as long as I can remember.

Seeing the prayers reminded me of the upcoming Thanksgiving Holiday and the fact that many of you may be asked to give a prayer before your holiday meal. One of the things most Episcopalians dislike to do is to pray extemporaneously, so I thought I could give you a couple of options that you might use should you be asked to pray in the days and weeks ahead.

One of my favorite prayers to use in public is to pray, "May the One who blesses bless." I love this prayer because of its brevity, and it is unlikely to offend anyone. It is also unexpected, and it causes people to think and may even serve as a conversation starter. The tried and true prayer I hear used most often is this one: "Bless, O Lord, this food to our use and us to your service, and keep us ever mindful of the needs of others, in Christ's name. Amen." Now, there are slight variations on this prayer, but I hear it used by both Roman Catholics and Protestants, so it probably serves us in the Episcopal Church fairly well.



The prayer I find myself using most often is this prayer: "Almighty God, we give you thanks for this day, for (add petitions here), we ask you to bless (us, this food, the hands that prepared it, et al), and keep us mindful of the needs of others, especially (add concerns and petitions), in Jesus name we pray, Amen."

Ultimately, pray from your heart. I don't think you can get it wrong. I like brevity and simplicity. Others may want a long, thoughtful prayer. The purpose of the meal blessing is always to offer thanksgiving to the God who created us and loves us and continues to provide for us. If you'd like some other options, open The Book of Common Prayer to the Prayers and Thanksgiving section found on pages 814-841. Grace at meals are found on page 835. Stewardship Campaign Underway




- Sunday's 8 a.m. services will continue to be held in the chapel.
