The Sunday of Memorial Day weekend was always an event for my family. The day had quite the itinerary which included church, a visit to Fort Custer National Cemetery, and family dinner. Like clockwork, those of us who were "in-town" would gather in the afternoon to pay respect to the three generations of servicemen who had sailed the seven seas and now lay interred with their brothers and sisters in arms just outside of town.

Visiting that garden of stone was always special. Stories of the men whom I grew up revering were always told on the way– some new and some old. Finding a way back to where they were was always interesting as each of us had our own, proven landmark that would ensure we would be the first to "discover" them. In the years since, landmarks are no longer necessary. My heart knows the way and so do my children.

There is something that is grounding in seeing thousands of flags unfurled at gravesides of those who had fallen and those who lay at rest. There was something strangely wonderful in seeing the young children there those days carrying around the flag that was planted where their pop was, watching it flutter as they skipped through the spaces between the headstones. Sometimes I'd catch myself wishing that I'd see the ghost of my father sitting on the bench that was by his marker – watching his grandson touch the headstone of a man he never got the chance to meet.

There, we'd leave an offering of flowers, wash their stones, clip back the grass, and remember. We'd re-member them, channel them, and pray. I've often wondered if on those days the souls of those who love us wait for us. Memories of them would flood my mind as we said the words that were given to us. And then, as if in answer to those prayers, the laughter of children would call us back to the present and we knew that those we love and see no longer didn't have to wait – for they lived on in the hearts of their grandchildren who carried their own memories of them. They lived on in us who knew them. And they had so since the day they passed – walking every step of the way with us and remaining as close to us as prayer.

My friends, let us pray: O Judge of the nations, we remember before you with grateful hearts the men and women of our country who in the day of decision ventured much for the liberties we now enjoy. Grant that we may not rest until all the people of this land share the benefits of true freedom and gladly accept its disciplines. This we ask in the Name of Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.




