These days I find myself saying a lot of goodbyes. In proportion to "Hello" or "Hi. How are you?" however, farewells are a drop in the bucket — so there is that to consider. And yet, the feelings I have go quite deep. I don't know about you, but the emotional weight of these goodbyes is profound. After reflection, I realize that if the feelings I have in these moments are as strong as they are for me personally, I can only imagine how deep they go for some of you who are saying goodbye to lifelong friends and do dahs.

Throughout the years I have created a scrapbook of poems that I return to again and again when I am having trouble expressing what I need to. I don't know why I started but the fact remains that something about these poems captures an essence I can't quite put my finger on when approaching existential limits. I wonder if you have things like that or if there are mediums that help you make sense of feelings that are often intense and at times leave you wondering what you should do with them.

Something in me says that, as your priest, I should say that you should take those feelings to God in prayer, and you should! Please hear that. Nevertheless, I know there are times when we don't have the words. I've also had to learn that not having the words is okay - that silence is okay. I've even heard that silence was the first language, God's language, and therefore a powerful conduit of creation. Yet stillness and quietness often reveal a great restlessness within us. And the more I am silent, I realize that the part of me that is restless and that seeks has to do with these goodbyes, impermanence, and, most profoundly, hope.

In his book *Confessions*, St. Augustine opens up to God by saying, "our hearts are restless until they rest in you." And, if there was ever a sentence that describes how I feel when standing next to someone when saying goodbye or who through circumstance must depart from our community, I feel a deep sense of restlessness that holds many other feelings. I wonder if you feel that way at times?

I believe that the part of me that is restless at those moments, that sees and feels these intense feelings of joy when I approach certain thresholds in life must be the part of what is deep in me calling out to what is deep in you. (Ps. 42:7) It must be the Spirit that Paul talks about in his letter to the Romans that calls to your Spirit, which is ultimately God's Spirit longing to be whole. Perhaps that is why goodbyes are so hard... because deep down we know we are meant to be together and that when we are, we are that much closer to God.

This, my friends, is something to celebrate and something to feel. The way we say goodbye matters. The way we feel matters a great deal. It bears witness to what once was and now, what will be. That is, until at long last, in the fullness of time we rest in Christ with those who sojourned with us in this wonderful thing called life.

Be still. Be at Peace. You are loved.


