

### "What's Cookin?"

One sure fire way, albeit not the most scientific way, in measuring vitality is to sit in a gathering and feel the energy that's present. I've heard from several folks about how wonderful it felt to be with everyone at the annual meeting - sharing a meal with one another, and looking

ahead to what is in store during our time together this year. If it's one thing St. Luke's knows how to do it is to eat well, and more importantly - to gather.

For the past year our Young Disciples and Men's group has committed to meeting weekly, despite COVID restrictions and its associated challenges. They have modelled for me healthy and intentional ways that folks can still meet and make the most of what they have. Learning from them this past year has been such an honor for me and I hope to be able to replicate their method of communication and intentionality in offering two more ways that we can gather in the next couple of months. First is through a program called Midweek Manna and second is through the return of Coffee Hour!

Briefly, the idea behind Manna is to offer a space where we can intentionally focus on some intergenerational interaction through a shared meal. After we spend some time eating with one another, groups (Adult, Children, and Youth) will then break up into groups and have

an opportunity to share formation time with each other. In the coming weeks we will roll out our program for Manna during Lent, but the first dinner is already set: Shepherd's Pie. Midweek Manna will begin on March 9<sup>th</sup> at 5:45 p.m. in Metcalf Hall and end by 8:00 p.m.

Now, Coffee Hour. COVID has certainly changed the way we gather at church and it certainly has changed the way we gather after church. For one, I know Eggbert's has seen an increase in traffic. And while I can't promise an omelette bar at Luke's Place (well not yet) what I can do is offer some awesome cookies for the return of Coffee Hour on Sunday March 13<sup>th</sup> after the 10:30 service. Coffee Hour's first Sunday back will feature cookies from Susan Miller - formerly of the Rolling Pin. I encourage you to stay after Church and catch-up from last week and perhaps set-up for the week ahead with friends.

Finally, with Lent on the horizon that means Shrove Tuesday is on the horizon - March 1<sup>st</sup>. We will ease back into our tradition of the great and blessed feast of pancakes this year and I'm happy to say that we are adding something new to that tradition. 

Hi all,

Thank you for praying for our ministry! I'm thanking God that my Thai tutor, who is a Christian, asked me how I share my faith. Now we are going through the passages (using Thai) that I use in the "Intentional for a Lifetime" course. Please ask God to keep his heart open as we keep talking about who God is, so that he will gain a bigger vision for reaching out to the people God will bring to him. I've also started working with a second Thai tutor. She is helping me with how to make my presentation in Thai to parents of adult children with disabilities. I'm really enjoying my interaction with both tutors.

Roger and I are working on meeting with Northern Thai pastors and praying for their church members, who are actively reaching out to their Northern Thai friends. According to many, the Northern Thai people group is the least reached group in Northern Thailand. Through prayer we are hoping to understand more of how the Northern Thailand. New Testament can become a blessing to many.

The husband of one of our coworkers, who lives in a nearby country and is a citizen there, died. He had had a stroke, and we had been praying for several days as they worked to get medical help for him. We are sad about our coworker's great loss. Her husband is also survived by their very young son. Please ask God to comfort the many people who are grieving.

Luke has recovered from Covid, but Juliette is still not feeling strong The care of their two-year-old son has become difficult for her, and they have now hired someone to help a few days a week. Please ask God to give healing and strength to Juliette.

## Theologians Corner



Continuing with our focus on getting back to basics and catechesis, we will be reading and discussing Being Christian at our Faith Forum for the next few weeks. "In this simple, beautifully written book Rowan Williams explores four essential components of the Christian life: baptism, Bible, Eucharist, and prayer.

Despite huge differences in Christian thinking and practice both today and in past centuries, he says, these four basic elements have remained constant and indispensable for the majority of those who call themselves Christians.

In accessible, pastoral terms Williams discusses the meaning and practice of baptism, the Bible, the Eucharist, and prayer, inviting readers to really think through the Christian faith and how to live it out. Questions for reflection and discussion at the end of each chapter help readers to dig deeper and apply Williams's insights to their own lives."


