UGANDAN ORPHAN SPONSORSHIP GREAT CHRISTMAS GIFTS - ONLY \$400

The 2017 school year in Uganda begins in February. Now is the time to step up once again to sponsor at least six orphan students in Uganda. With a sponsorship gift of \$400, the student is provided tuition, room, board and clothing for the year. Matching gifts from employers can make this two for one for sponsors. This is managed through BARHD (Bushenyi Alliance for Rural Health & Development in Southwest Uganda). The schools are Anglican and were started over twenty years ago in this rural and impoverished district in Uganda.

Pictures and letters of two students are on the bulletin board in the main hallway. This is also where you can sign up to be a sponsor. One can sign up for the full sponsorship or just half – or even less. Together we should be able to sponsor at least six. To date St. Luke's has sponsored at least 174 students. If you have any questions or are ready to be a sponsor, contact Fr. Lee.

The Search Committee wants the parish to know that Canon Bill Carroll is now actively involved in our search process. He contacted Jim this week to let us know that several priests have visited the Office of Transition Ministry website and are looking at St. Luke's.

While we are very encouraged by this interest, no candidate has submitted a formal application for our rector position.

We want to remind the parish what Bishop Ed shared with us a few weeks ago:

- Historically, this is a slow time of the year for the rector search process.
- St. Luke's has great leadership both Lay and Clergy. Fr. Sean will be here after Fr. Lee's departure to make sure there is pastoral and sacramental presence.

We ask you to pray for the rector candidates, Search Committee, and Vestry during our mutual discernment process for our next rector.
