PENTECOST SUNDAY

Sunday, June 4, is the Day of Pentecost, which marks the day when the Holy Spirit descended upon the Apostles. Pentecost Sunday occurs 50 days after Easter and is also known as the birthday of the Church. Pentecost launched the large-scale spreading of the Gospel after Jesus' ascension. Pentecost is represented with the color red, which symbolizes the fire of the Holy Spirit. If you can, wear **RED** on Sunday, June 4.

Thoughts from Fr. Sean



There's a birthday coming up, this weekend—the birthday of The Church. Annually we celebrate something called "Pentecost" and yet, I wonder if everybody knows why. As a cradle Episcopalian, I grew up knowing that at one point in the year I was expected to don a red shirt go to church for a picture—that was the extent of my Pentecost knowledge. Thankfully through the years, I have

been instructed as to why that was an important day. In short, Pentecost is the birthday of The Church. After Jesus sacrificed himself for humanity, the disciples found themselves in a time of transition: They knew that something miraculous had happened; they knew that Christ was the Son of Man, yet they didn't have a clear notion of what to DO with that knowledge. Enter Pentecost. Post-ascension Jesus, the apostles are left in a room with their ponderings; I can imagine a group of people naval-gazing and wondering what to do next. Then the Holy Spirit shows up and lights them on spiritual fire, thereby enabling them with the energy, spirit and ability to preach the Word to all who would listen, thus birthing the Church.

So why, after two millennia, do we continue this practice of memorialization and celebration? I think there are many good answers to that question, but the one that strikes closest to home for me is this: Right now, it is more important than ever before to feel the power of the Holy Spirit moving through us, urging us to come together with one purpose—to love and love wholly (and Holy) everyone around us. We see declining numbers in denominations across the globe; we witness acts of terrorism and hate nearly every day; we watch in disbelief as the world seemingly crumbles away as evil takes its toll on the good of humanity. Pentecost is a not-so-gentle reminder that we are called and enabled by the Holy Spirit to combat that with our love, our time, and our comforting presence to all who seek God. There are plenty of opportunities to allow the Spirit to move through us and to impact the world. We can volunteer to help those in need via Family Promise (see pg. 1); we can evangelize to the surrounding community by means of signing up and being present at the booth during Sun Fest (see pg. 3); we can volunteer to help our kids better understand the good news of Jesus Christ through curriculum such as Vacation Bible School (see next column); and many other ways.

This Sunday, be reminded that the Holy Spirit came and breathed new life into the existing believers and gave them a name: Church. Now, go out and DO. Be thankful. Be Blessed. Be Church.

PARISH UPDATE ST. LUKE'S RECTOR SEARCH PROCESS

The St. Luke's Rector Search Committee is very pleased to update the St. Luke's parish family on the search process.

We recently completed online video interviews with our pool of rector candidates. Our approach was to have a conversation with the candidates about themselves and about St. Luke's. We found these conversations to be most valuable and very productive.

Following the interviews, we assessed each candidate's background, experience, philosophy and personality. We also spent a great deal of time in prayer, individual reviews, and group discussions to determine which candidates might be a good fit with St. Luke's.

Through that process, we identified top candidates whom we believe deserve more consideration and further conversation. We are now entering the next phase of our rector search process. We are arranging site visits to the home and parish of our top candidates.

We anticipate these visits to include extended time with the candidate and their family as well as an opportunity to experience a worship service at their church. In addition, we want to spend time in conversation about St. Luke's – who we are; what we do; where we want to go; and, what we need in our next rector.

Our search process journey has been a long one for the parish, for the Vestry and for our committee. We continue to have faith that we are on the right path to find the right priest God intends to be the next rector for our beloved St. Luke's.

We also believe that your prayers do make a difference. Please continue praying for the Vestry, our committee and top candidates as we continue our respective discernment processes.
