

Christmas Memories

One of my most vivid Christmas memories occurred over ten years ago. I was driving to St. James Church in downtown Baton Rouge, and I stopped at a convenience store to purchase a soft drink.

The woman serving at the counter was Hindu, and when she finished ringing up my transaction she said, "Happy Holidays."

Then, either she recognized my clerical collar or something else in my demeanor triggered in her a sense she had said something wrong, and she said, "I mean Merry Christmas."

We live in interesting times. Maybe something is wrong with me, but I was not offended that a Hindu woman at a Circle K convenience store said, "Happy Holidays" instead of "Merry Christmas." The fact that she was willing to acknowledge the holiday at all impressed me. In her act of wishing me "a Merry Christmas," she offered me hospitality. In this mad season of running about preparing for Christmas, a small Hindu woman working for minimum wage in a local convenience store offered me a Merry Christmas.

In so many ways this is the story of the incarnation of God that we celebrate at Christmastime. In the most unlikely of places and circumstances the Messiah of God entered human history. The messiah was not born the son of a king or queen but as the illegitimate child of a 14-year-old unwed mother. One of the central themes of the Christmas story is God works through the most unlikely circumstances and people.

Whether someone wishes you a Merry Christmas or Happy Holidays or Happy Hanukah or just a polite Good Morning, may the spirit of the Christ child fill you with wonder and joy in this season of Holy Days.







