Conditions of Readiness

Invariably most mornings I can count on two things when I arrive at church. One, the first thing Margaret says to me is, "Coffee is done," and then she is back to whatever project she is working on at the moment. The other, is that I can pretty much count on either Jeff Birk or Dennis Mueggenborg already at work in the office either answering phones or keeping the books straight. We are blessed, my friends, to have these folks giving of themselves in service to the Lord at Luke's place day in and day out.

Every now and then the dynamic will shift slightly and instead of coffee, I'll hear about the finer points of which grass seed we should choose, whether that be fescue or Bermuda and, more importantly, when or where we should not plant it. All of this of course takes place while news reports of COVID cases rise, kids go back to school, old friends share about our time in and off the coast of Afghanistan, the Steeple has yet to be written, and pastoral calls are waiting to be tended to. And so, as the day is new - we begin again.

I don't know about you, but holding all of that at once is rather cumbersome and so I lay it down most mornings at the feet of Jesus and give thanks for conversations about grass and where Jim Grillot left all the light bulbs. In that moment gratitude begins to rise. Not because the weight is gone – but that I am aware of the answering of prayers both near and far despite it all.

I confess that the exposure letter you received last week was the first one I have had to write in over a year and a half. This is due in large part to the vestry who took on the role of shepherding the flock through the pandemic without a major outbreak occurring at St. Luke's. When any of those folks take time to sit with me, I look at them with awe. I give thanks for them and for the way they kept us and continue to keep us safe. And I give thanks for everyone in this parish who, despite some very convicting positions, put the needs of others before themselves. If that is not respect, I don't know what is.

I was so thankful for the way we were able to come together last week, test, evaluate, serve, and to do all of that as efficient as if we had been through the drill a hundred times. To an old sailor, that says something. For it reveals that a condition of readiness has been achieved that you hope your crew continues to improve upon and maintains even in the face of great distress.

As you go about the rest of the week and into the weekend, I want to share a prayer with you that helps me out quite a bit in times like these – it's called, "In the Morning" and it goes like this, "This is another day, O Lord. I know not what it will bring forth, but make me ready, Lord, for whatever it may be. If I am to stand up, help me to stand bravely. If I am to sit still, help me to sit quietly. If I am to lie low, help me to do it patiently. And if I am to do nothing, let me do it gallantly. Make these words more than words, and give me the Spirit of Jesus. Amen.
