This weekend marks the 20th anniversary of the September 11th attacks. Most of us, I think, remember exactly where we were that day. We remember what we were doing and then being glued to the television as the events of the day continued to unfold. I was sitting next to Teresa the other night and it hit me – the end of 2021 will be the first time in the lives of my children that they will know an America who to a degree, has ceased active combat operations in the Middle East.

As I prepare to meet with the Young Disciples this evening, I've been thinking about ways that I could engage them with this insight - offering both a bit of context and hope on the cusp of a new horizon. As time marches on however, the work of our memory will become more important and is critical to the thoughtful reflection that goes hand in hand with passing the torch on to future generations. How we do that prayerfully is what I hope to talk with them about tonight. Please keep us in your prayers.

One of the ways that continues to help me mark this day is through the work of StoryCorps. "StoryCorps' September 11th Initiative was launched in 2005 in partnership with the National September 11th Memorial & Museum to record at least one story to honor each of the lives lost during the attacks on September 11, 2001, and the February 26, 1993, World Trade Center bombing." As of September 11th, 2020 over 1,000 stories have been recorded, memorializing 600 victims. Listening to these stories often helps me connect emotion and memory with the prayers given to us to pray on the day that is before us. I commend the work of StoryCorps to you and even remember the first story I heard by Beverly Eckert. If you have time, perhaps you might listen to her before you pray:

O Almighty God, who brings good out of evil and turns even the wrath of your children towards your promised peace: Hear our prayers this day as we remember those of many nations and differing faiths whose lives were cut short by the fierce flames of anger and hatred. Hasten the time when the menace of war shall be removed. Cleanse both us and those perceived to be our enemies of all hatred and distrust. Pour out the spirit of peace on all the rulers of our world that we may be brought through strife to the lasting peace of the kingdom of your Son; Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

About Family Promise...

Family Promise is St. Luke's way to help local families transition from homelessness to selfsufficiency. We were one of the first churches in Bartlesville to participate in the program since its start several years ago. And we've continued to provide support despite the challenges of the Covid pandemic, which temporarily curtailed in-church housing of homeless families.

Since early 2020, families benefiting from the program have been staying overnight at the limited living accommodations are Anchor House, with supporting churches providing evening meals and household necessities. While at Anchor House, the adult members of the family are counseled in goal-setting, finding employment, furthering their education, budgeting, job retention and assistance with other issues that have contributed to their current situation. School-age children attend local schools.

Just recently, St. Luke's made its garage apartment rental property available to a graduate of Family Promise who otherwise would not have found suitable, affordable housing for herself and her young daughter.






