Easter Blooms Twice

Every Easter, white lilies array the altar at St. Luke's and do so for a few Sundays after the great paschal feast. After a few weeks, however, it is time to offer them to folks to take home and plant, minding that they remember the covenant one enters into when taking a lily home; thou shalt not take home the clay pot as well. There is usually a few of them left over even after a good picking. And so, Margaret usually takes what is left and plants them in the flower beds around the church. You usually must wait an entire year to see one bloom again, however, this week an Easter lily opened up to greet the sun and you guessed it – with its bloom came an alleluia from our dear sexton, along with a few admirers from the neighborhood.

On these long summer afternoons, it is not uncommon for me to look out the window of my office and see folks strolling by - taking in the beauty of Luke's place. Why some even stop and sit for a spell in the garden. And every now and then a flower will appear on the grass just before me, adorning the grave of a loved one. The word that most often comes to mind when people find rest here, is hallowed - for the interchange in noticing the need to lay something down and acquiescing to the impulse is holy and sometimes really hard work.

I am not trying to be presumptuous here but I know that some of you may find yourselves "heavy laden" especially with all that is going on right now - so much so that even the offer of rest may seem like a luxury. I've been there and have known how unbelievably hard it is to break free from difficult cycles. And I've also learned that most of us carry our burdens around like the character Mendoza from the movie the mission. But it doesn't have that way.

Jesus once said, "Come unto me all ye that travail and are heavy laden, and I will refresh you." I hope you recognize those words as an invitation right now to do what you must. And you know what? "There is always a before and an after. My advice, travel light. Choose only what you need most to see you through." And when you do, stop to smell the flowers and remember that Easter comes round even when you don't expect it.

About Family Promise...

Family Promise is St. Luke's way to help local families transition from homelessness to selfsufficiency. We were one of the first churches in Bartlesville to participate in the program since its start several years ago. And we've continued to provide support despite the challenges of the Covid pandemic, which temporarily curtailed in-church housing of homeless families.

Since early 2020, families benefiting from the program have been staying overnight at the limited living accommodations are Anchor House, with supporting churches providing evening meals and household necessities. While at Anchor House, the adult members of the family are counseled in goal-setting, finding employment, furthering their education, budgeting, job retention and assistance with other issues that have contributed to their current situation. School-age children attend local schools.

Just recently, St. Luke's made its garage apartment rental property available to a graduate of Family Promise who otherwise would not have found suitable, affordable housing for herself and her young daughter.

Although we really miss our friends in Bartlesville, we feel that we have made the right decision in moving; It is so good to be able to spend time with Sophia and Chris and the kids, particularly after not having seen them for a couple of years because of COVID. It took six days driving plus another three waiting in Maine for the results of a COVID test before we could cross the border. We have been in Canada a little over a month and throughout that time have been consumed with cross-border requirements - terminating contracts in the U.S. and initiating others in Canada, often with specified deadlines - and dealing time and again with amazing incompetence on both sides of the border, which just prolongs the whole process. But the end of the tunnel is starting to appear, which has given us time, finally, to write and say "MANY THANKS" and how we miss all of you.
