

Dear St. Luke's

It will be my pleasure to introduce you to my friend, Dr. Stephen White next week as he journeys to Bartlesville to spend the week with us. Dr. White is currently the Director of Music at St. Thomas Episcopal Church, Battle Creek, Michigan where he oversees the parish music ministry,

conducts the graded choral program (RSCM), and plays for all parish liturgies. Dr. White is currently discerning the next phase of his ministry in the church and I am proud to welcome him here as a friend and a brother.

Dr. White has served parishes of various denominations in Michigan, Florida, Kentucky and Texas, coordinated the music for the consecration of the IX Bishop of the Diocese of Western Michigan, and has served on both public school and university music education teaching faculties. Dr. White is also active as a recitalist having performed at the Cathedral of St. Paul (Detroit), St. Paul's Episcopal Church (Port Huron), Grace Episcopal Church (Holland), St. Thomas Episcopal Church (Louisville, KY), First United Methodist Church (Midland, TX), St. Luke's Episcopal Church (Evanston, IL), as well as Coventry, Bristol, Southwark, and Truro Cathedrals in the United Kingdom.

Dr. White is an elected member of the Association of Anglican Musicians (AAM), serving on both its Professional Concerns and Development and Gerre Hancock Fellowship committees, is Dean of the Southwest Michigan Chapter of The American Guild of Organists, is a member of the American Choral Directors Association (ACDA), and the College Music Society (CMS). He is a Fellow of both the Fraternity of St. Cecilia and the Guild of Musicians and Singers, and holds degrees in Music Education from Florida State University (PhD), Northwestern University (MMus), and Michigan State University (BMus).

There will be plenty of opportunities to meet Dr. White next week and I encourage all of you to take the opportunity to do so if you can. Stephen will be arriving late Sunday night

on January 22nd and will depart after our services the following Sunday on the 29th. During his time here he will have the opportunity to meet our vestry, spend some time in Tulsa, rehearse with the choir, meet Y.D., accompany me to Green Country and Pub Theology, and hopefully get out for some extended time to see our beautiful town. I trust he will enjoy his time here and moreover the time he with spend you. Please join me in praying for his safe travel:

O God, our heavenly Father, whose glory fills the whole creation, and whose presence we find wherever we go: Preserve those who travel, in particular Stephen; surround him with your loving care; protect him from every danger; and bring him in safety to his journey's end; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Theologians Corner:

Fabian, Bishop and Martyr of Rome, 250.

In 236, an assembly was held at Rome to elect a pope as successor to Antherus. In the throng was Fabian, a layman from another part of Italy. Suddenly, according to the historian Eusebius, a dove flew over the crowd and lighted on Fabian's head. In spite of the fact that he was both a total stranger and not even a candidate for election, the people unanimously chose Fabian to be pope, shouting, "He is worthy!" Fabian was ordained to the episcopate without opposition.

During his fourteen years as pontiff, Fabian made numerous administrative reforms. He developed the parochial structure of the Church in Rome, and established the

custom of venerating martyrs at their shrines in the catacombs. He appointed seven deacons and seven sub-deacons to write the lives of the martyrs, so that their deeds

should not be forgotten in times to come.

When Privatus, in Africa, stirred up a new heresy, Fabian vigorously opposed and condemned his actions. He also brought back to Rome, for proper burial, the remains of Pontian, a pope whom the emperor had exiled in 235 to a certain and rapid death in the mines of Sardinia.

The Emperor Decius ordered a general persecution of the Church in 239 and 240, probably the first persecution to be carried out in all parts of the empire. Fabian was one of the earliest of those martyred, setting a courageous example for his followers, many of whom died in great torment.

Cyprian of Carthage, in a letter to Cornelius, Fabian's successor, wrote that Fabian was an incomparable man. "The glory of his death," Cyprian commented, "befitted the purity and holiness of his life."

Fabian's tombstone, the slab which covered his gravesite, still exists. It is in fragments, but the words "Fabian . . . bishop . . . martyr" are still dimly visible.

Together we pray: Almighty God, who didst call Fabian to be a faithful pastor and servant of thy people, and to lay down his life in witness to thy Son: Grant that

we, strengthened by his example and aided by his prayers, may in times of trial and persecution remain steadfast in faith and endurance, for the sake of him who laid down his life for us all, Jesus Christ our Savior; who liveth and reigneth with thee

and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.
