

Vestry Academy Set for March 25th

As we come to the end of the first quarter, I'd like to take a moment and praise the Vestry for their hard work. This Saturday will be the 30th annual Vestry Academy at St. Crispin's Conference Center + Camp and once again your vestry will be there. Their dedication and faithfulness continues to inspire me. This year's focus will be on the Vestry member's role as a leader in their congregation.

In addition to the main focus there are the following tracks:

Track #1 Vestry Essentials (Doug McIver, Steve Roper, and Mark Peterson)

This track will help participants learn the essentials of how to be an effective Vestry leader, especially in the areas of the canons, finance, best practices, and roles of ministry. The track is especially recommended for new Vestry members.

Track #2 Congregational Vitality: Next Steps (Laura Birk, Karen Lewey, Nick Phares)

Canon Steve and Kate Bond will explore more deeply the connections between spirituality, formation, discernment, and contextual awareness for congregational vitality. Attendees will explore the data from Congregational Vitality Survey and how it helps us understand ask question about where God is calling us as congregations in the Diocese of Oklahoma.

Track #3 Stewardship (Nancy Woods, Karole Cozby, Katherine Powell, and Jo Baughman)


Start the process of planning your annual stewardship campaign by learning about the stewardship campaign process and best practices. This track will include expert advice in the planning and implementation of annual stewardship offerings across various congregational needs.

Theologians Corner:

Gregory the Illuminator
Bishop and Missionary of Armenia, c. 332



Armenia was the first nation-state to become officially Christian, and this set a precedent for the legalization of Christianity by the Emperor Constantine. As a buffer state between the more powerful empires of Rome and Persia, Armenia endured many shifts of policy, as first one and then the other empire took it “under protection.”

The accounts of Gregory, known as the Illuminator (or Enlightener) and as “Apostle of the Armenians,” are a mixture of legend and fact. He was born about 257. After his father assassinated the Persian King Chosroes I, the infant boy was rescued and taken to Caesarea in Cappadocia, where he was brought up as a Christian. He married a woman named Mary, who bore him two sons. About 280, he returned to Armenia, after experiencing various fortunes of honor and imprisonment, succeeded in converting King Tiridates to his faith. With the help of the King the country was Christianized, and paganism was rooted out. About 300, Gregory was ordained a bishop at Caesarea. He established his cathedral at Valarshapat, with his center of work nearby at Echmiadzin, now in Armenia, and still the spiritual center of Armenian Christianity.

There is no record that Gregory attended the First Ecumenical Council at Nicaea in 325, but a tradition records that he sent in his stead his younger son Aristages, whom he ordained as his successor. His last years were spent in solitude, and he died about 332.

Together we pray: Almighty God, who willest to be glorified in all thy saints, and didst raise up thy servant Gregory the Illuminator to be a light in the world, and to preach the Gospel to the people of Armenia: Shine, we pray thee, in our hearts, that we also in our generation may show forth thy praise, who hast called us out of darkness into thy marvelous light; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with thee and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.


