

A Blessed All Saints to you all.



Today's reading from the Letter to the Hebrews reminds of that love and that we are not alone even though we may feel like it sometimes. In fact, Paul writes that we are to remember the fact that we are surrounded by a great cloud of witnesses – the Saints and therefore, we should in whatever way we can throw off everything that hinders that knowledge and the sin that so easily entangles us, so that - we might run with perseverance the race marked out for us, while we still have time.

While the months ahead may at times feel like a race, please allow yourself to rest in that love that God has for you. Allow yourself the opportunity to drink from that deep well that is His grace so that you might come to know even more fully that:

Though Satan breaks our dark glass into shards
Each shard still shines with Christ's reflected light,
It glances from the eyes, kindles the words
Of all his unknown saints. The dark is bright
With quiet lives and steady lights undimmed,
The witness of the ones we shunned and shamed.
Plain in our sight and far beyond our seeing
He weaves them with us in the web of being
They stand beside us even as we grieve,
The lone and left behind whom no one claimed,
Unnumbered multitudes, he lifts above
The shadow of the gibbet and the grave,
To triumph where all saints are known and named;
The gathered glories of His wounded love.

<u>Theologian's Corner</u> Commemoration of All Faithful Departed

In the New Testament, the word "saints" is used to describe the entire membership of the Christian community, and, in the Collect for All Saints' Day, the word "elect" is used in a similar sense. From very early times, however, the word "saint" came to be applied primarily to persons of heroic sanctity, whose deeds were recalled with gratitude by later generations.

Beginning in the tenth century, it became customary to set aside another day—as a sort of extension of All Saints—on which the Church remembered that vast body of the faithful who, though no less members of the company of the redeemed, are unknown in the wider fellowship of the Church. It was also a day for particular remembrances of family members and friends.

Though the observance of the day was abolished at the Reformation because of abuses connected with Masses for the dead, a renewed understanding of its meaning has led to a widespread acceptance of this commemoration among Anglicans, and to its inclusion as an optional observance in the calendar of The Episcopal Church.



Together we pray: O God, the Maker and Redeemer of all believers; Grant to the faithful departed the unsearchable benefits of the passion of thy Son; that, on the day of his appearing they may be manifested as thy children; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with thee and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.




