

Dear friends in Christ,

This Sunday, we have the joy of welcoming Bishop Poulson Reed for his biannual visitation. As the Bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of Oklahoma, Bishop Reed brings a deep commitment to congregational vitality, outreach, and spiritual leadership. He has led our diocese since 2020 and oversees 68 congregations, Episcopal schools, chaplaincies, senior care centers, and the beloved St. Crispin's Conference Center and Camp. With a background that includes service in Colorado and Arizona and an M.F.A. from the University of Utah, Bishop Reed

brings both pastoral and creative insights to his ministry.

The Bishop's visit is an opportunity for St. Luke's to connect with the broader Church and to reaffirm our place within the Episcopal Diocese of Oklahoma. Bishop Poulson's presence with us is a reminder of our shared mission to serve Christ and each other. He will lead us in worship, offer reflections on faith, and meet with members of our congregation. This Sunday's service also holds special meaning for those among us who will be confirmed, received, or who will reaffirm their faith. Your support and prayers for them will bless and strengthen their commitment.
