

Second Week of Advent

Beloved in Christ,

Advent always has a way of arriving right when we need it most. Just as the light begins to leave the day behind earlier and earlier and where we feel a bit frayed at the edges, the Church quietly lights another candle and reminds us that hope is not a sentimental thing, it is God's steady promises breaking into the ordinary places of our lives.

In this second week of Advent, we hear again the voices of the prophets and the saints calling us to prepare the way of the Lord. Not by pretending everything is fine, but by daring us to believe that God can meet us even in the places that feel uncertain, weary, or unfinished. Advent hope is not fragile. It doesn't require perfect circumstances or perfect people. It simply asks that we stay awake to the God who is drawing near.

This is one of the great gifts of our tradition: the conviction that God's light grows even when the world gives us every reason to doubt that the sun will ever shine again. Every act of kindness, every moment of forgiveness, every small gesture of courage, these are how we lean into the promise that Emmanuel is not just a name but a lived reality.

As we move toward Christmas, I want to encourage you to make a commitment now to be present for our Christmas services this year. Bring your family. Invite a friend. Reach out to the neighbor who mentioned they've been looking for a place to worship. This season is full, yes, schedules are tight, and travel will demand our attention but gathering together, shoulder to shoulder, in the glow of candlelight is one of the ways we proclaim to the world that hope still has a home.

For some of us, this is the moment we've been waiting for. For others, it may be the first step back into a community or a first step toward finding one. Whatever your story, you never know what grace might meet you, or someone you love, when you walk through the doors on Christmas Eve.

My prayer for each of you this week is simple: that the God who comes quietly, faithfully, and tenderly will stir hope in your heart again and again. The kind of hope that reminds us we are not alone. The kind that carries us all the way to Bethlehem.

May the peace of Christ guard your hearts and your minds.

Theologian's Corner: **Thomas Merton** **Monk, Poet, Spiritual Writer 1968**



Thomas Merton was born in 1915 in France, of American parents. His early education was in France (Lycee de Montauban 1927-8) and England (Oakham School, 1929-32; Clare College, Cambridge, 1933-4). He came to America and attended Columbia University, graduated in English in 1938, worked there one year as a teaching assistant, and got his M.A. in 1939. In 1939 he joined the Roman Catholic Church, and taught at St Bonaventure for the next two years.

In 1941 he entered the Trappist monastery of Gethsemani near Louisville, Kentucky. The Trappists, called more formally Cistercians of the Strict Observance, are (or were before Vatican II) an extremely strict Roman Catholic monastic order, devoted to communal prayer (they spend at least four hours a day in chapel, chanting the praises of God), to private prayer and contemplation, to study, and to manual labor. Except for those whose special duties require otherwise, they are vowed not to speak except in praise of God. Thus, when not singing in chapel, they are silent.

Toward the end of his life, Merton developed an interest in Buddhist and other Far Eastern approaches to mysticism and contemplation, and their relation to Christian approaches. He was attending an international conference on Christian and Buddhist monasticism in Bangkok, Thailand, when he was accidentally electrocuted on 10 December 1968.

Together we pray: Gracious God, who didst call thy monk Thomas Merton to proclaim thy justice out of silence, and moved him in his contemplative writings to perceive and value Christ at work in the faiths of others: Keep us, like him, steadfast in the knowledge and love of Jesus Christ; who with thee and the Holy Spirit livest and reignest, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.


