### Dear St Luke's Family,

*For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.*

— Romans 8: 26-39

I had the privilege of reading this beloved passage from the Apostle Paul at the 10:30 service last Sunday. I thought afterwards, "Gosh, I needed that."

I needed that because, let's face it, our church family is facing some challenges right now. It's easy to get discouraged if we focus just on the uncertainties: Who will be our next rector? How long will it take to find him or her? Will church attendance decline while we're in this transition period? Even after a new rector is found, will he or she be the right person to be our spiritual guide for years to come?

The list of questions and what ifs could go on and on. But wait, what is Paul telling us? He's saying, at least to me, that God is always with us. God's love for us is timeless and boundless. God's love and care will always be there to see us through no matter what. Yes, it's okay to have questions about the future, but God is there to help us figure out the answers.

Some of you may remember the pop song from the late '80s, "Don't worry, be happy." I enjoyed the upbeat reggae rhythm but I've always thought the lyrics were kind of stupid and naive. It's human to worry. If you don't worry about things, you're probably not paying attention to the world around you. There's a whole lot of worrisome stuff out there!

So how do we manage those worries? By letting God wrap his loving around us every day. Through some of the most beautiful language in the Bible, Paul is reminding us, "God has got you." God, as demonstrated through his son Jesus, gives us unshakable hope for the future. With God on our side, what chance is there for worry to overcome us?

But don't be lulled into thinking that all you need to do is dump your concerns on God and walk away. I like to think of our relationship with God as a participatory undertaking. He has expectations for us. He puts opportunities before us, and he expects us to take advantage of them.

And speaking of opportunities, one should have shown up in your mailbox within the last few days – the parish survey (see details on page 6 of this Steeple). This survey is a here-and-now way for you to help shape the future of St. Luke's. It's an invitation for you to team up with God to figure out what happens next. Please give it your full attention.

Paul's message underscores that God has promised to never leave us regardless of the challenges we face as individuals...or as a community of believers. Let's show God that his promise is recognized and cherished.

## Theologian's Corner:

### Joanna, Mary, and Salome

### The myrrh-bearers

### Feast Day August 3<sup>rd</sup>

Joanna, Mary, and Salome are traditionally counted as the three women who came to Jesus' tomb early in the morning on the day of the resurrection in order to anoint his body with myrrh and other spices. They were

followers of Jesus during his earthly ministry and remained with him throughout his arrest, crucifixion, and burial, and they discovered his empty tomb after his resurrection.

Little is known about the lives of Joanna, Mary, and Salome beyond their faithful and unwavering devotion and service to Christ. Joanna is identified in the Gospel of Luke as the wife of Chuza, a steward of Herod, and in Luke 8:2–3 is counted among the women who followed and provided for Jesus after having been healed by him.

The Gospel of Mark includes Salome in a list of women present at the crucifixion without any further information; according to early Christian tradition Salome was a relative of Mary the Mother of Jesus.

In addition to Joanna, Salome, and Mary Magdalene, Matthew 28:1 lists a woman it refers to as “the other Mary.” Mark 16:1 refers to her as Mary the mother of James. John 19:25 recounts that Mary the wife of Cleopas was present at the crucifixion, and historically the Christian tradition has tended to assume that all three of these Marys are actually the same person.

The little information that we do have about these women shows them to be faithful disciples and worthy of our commemoration and, more importantly, emulation. There is a particular devotion to these “Holy Myrrhbearers” in the Orthodox Church, and the second Sunday after Easter is celebrated as “Myrrhbearers Sunday”.

ALMIGHTY God, who revealed the resurrection of your Son to Joanna, Mary and Salome as they faithfully came bearing myrrh to his tomb: Grant that we too may perceive the presence of the risen Lord in the midst of pain and fear, and go forth proclaiming his resurrection; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

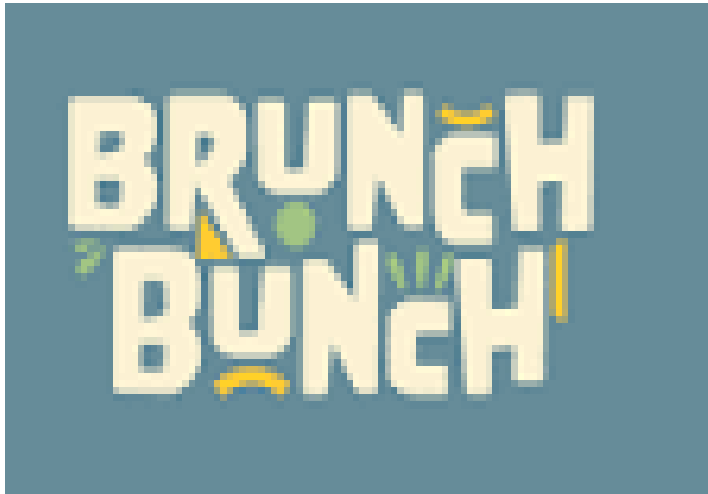
What time does church start? The moment you get in the car.

# 5th ANNUAL LIP SYNC BATTLE IN BARTLESVILLE

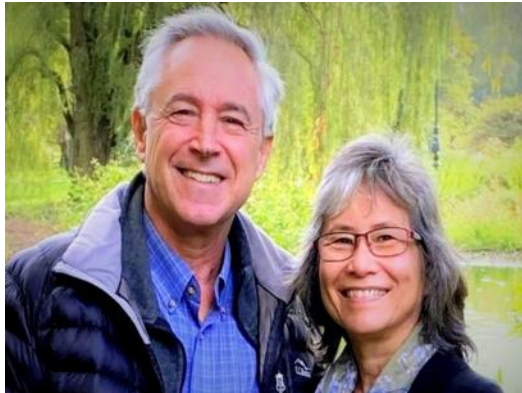

## **News from the Greens**

Hi friends,

Thank you for your partnership in prayer.

In a few hours, Roger will begin teaching the Facebook workshop for the Yene Christians who live in a country near Thailand. **Please ask God to inspire them as they develop culturally sensitive and creative media aiming to draw people to Scripture.**

Some women on our team will be joining me again for the "Quiet Times Together" event being planned for Aug. 27 to 29. This time we'll focus on 2 Timothy. Please ask God to bring a rich time of fellowship with God and with each other at our Saturday of Quiet Times Together.

Praise God with us for BP's excellent teaching design for helping the Ngap people to reflect and to make plans for how to share Good News. Please continue to ask God to give good health for all and easy travel from the country near Thailand for the Sept. 1 to 4 Good News workshop. Lina has consistently encouraged us to use the story of the man of the Gerasenes as a good first story for them to practice and to share with non-Christians. This would not be my recommendation for people in my own "guilt-innocence" culture, but for "fear-power" cultures, this is a Bible story that is relevant to them. Please ask God to guide us in how to set up the practice sessions for the Ngap Christian leaders.

One thing that has brought joy to my heart is that Sky, her mom, her aunt and her cousins have agreed to meet with me once a week to pray together about what is hard in their lives. A Bible

verse will also be shared at each prayer time. The mothers are very happy. Please ask God to touch the hearts of Sky and her cousins so they will want to follow Jesus.

Lastly, we request your confidential prayer for Nathan's living situation and for his medical challenges. Please ask God to give wisdom about Nathan's living situation. Please also ask God to help the medical providers who will coach him in habits which can positively impact his medical issues. Some complications have arisen in Nathan's living situation, and we need God's wisdom to make the right decisions. We request that you not talk about this with Nathan, so it won't cause more stress to him.

Roger often gets happy feedback from people who are grateful for how he sets up websites, apps and radio programs for their Scripture materials. Here is a recent note from a worker in Southern Thailand:

Roger, this looks great!! . . . You have done a great job. May this app be used by God to bring many to Christ!

We thank God for encouraging words.

Thank you for praying for our adjustment back to Thailand. We thank God that our car and house were ok when we got here, and we eventually got over the rough bout with jet lag. Praise to God that Roger and I are both feeling well.
