Dear St Luke's Family,

This summer has been one for the record books. I am so relieved we are in the -Ber months now. Temps should be dropping soon. Don't know about yours, but my yard is just dust and dried stalks of crunchy grass.

You did it! You filled the plastic tote for Concern last Sunday! Awesome! Lets do it again this coming Sunday! Please? Grab a couple of canned goods out of your cupboard and bring them with you on Sunday when you come to church. It's a small thing that means so much. With everyone giving one or two canned goods, we can fill that tote for the second week in a row.

And just a reminder for those of you who are planning to attend the big fundraiser for Concern, it's this Saturday at the Hilton Garden Inn. I hope to see you there at the St Luke's table.

Let's talk Coffee Hour. Didn't you enjoy last Sunday when Canon Betsy was here and we had coffee hour? I can't tell you how many have been in the office asking why we can't have coffee hour on a regular basis. That also showed up in the surveys. The truth is: no one is stopping coffee hour from happening. The church does provide the coffee (treats are optional) but what needs to happen is volunteers to host. 'Someone' has to fix the coffee, 'someone' needs to clean up after and stay after everyone has left, someone' needs to turn off the lights and the coffee machine, and lastly 'someone' needs to lock the door. I can't tell you how many times Courtney

and I have walked into the church on a Monday morning and smelt burnt coffee and found the pot left on with crusty coffee or even shattered on the hot plate. This is a fire hazard. Not to mention it will eventually ruin the coffee maker. I'm already 2 coffee pots behind ordering new ones and that's just since June. We need those 'someone's, those volunteers to maintain coffee hour. I have several times put out sign up lists at the window of the kitchen. It may fill up for a month or so, but then the sign ups stop. Mainly because it becomes the same folks week after week, trying to keep the fellowship going and getting burnt out. And who can blame them? It takes volunteers to maintain coffee hour. Again, treats are just optional. But if you want coffee hour to happen, then volunteer to host, to clean up, and to stay after everyone leaves to make sure everything is in order when the church is locked. Coffee Hour can happen as long as there are volunteers to oversee the time and maintenance. If you are the 'someone' who makes the coffee, but doesn't stay to see that cleanup and coffee maker & lights are turned off, then do you know if 'someone' else is going to follow through? If you are of the mind, 'someone' else will take care of it, then it just won't happen. And it hasn't. The only thing stopping coffee hour is 'someone' to volunteer.

They have compiled the surveys (thank you to everyone who filled one out) and have completed the Parish Profile (thank you, Nancy Woods, for all your wonderful work on this!) - it is ready to print. They will be available to the parish once they are printed and digitized. It is quite a work of art. The hope is to have the Parish Profile to the Diocese and possible candidates by October 1st.

Life is continuing here at St. Luke's. All our ministries, classes, and events are happening and we are a busy parish. If you think no one is driving this St Luke's bus, you need to follow Karole Cozby around. You will see we are quite secure in our leadership.

Theologian's Corner:

St . Ninian

Bishop

430 A.D.

Feast Day- September 16th



Ninian is also called Nynia, Ninias, Rigna, Trignan, Ninnidh, Ringan, Ninus, or Dinan. He was a Celt, born in southern Scotland in about 360, and is regarded as the first major preacher of the Gospel to the people living in Britain north of the Wall--that is, living outside the territory that had been under Roman rule. He is said to have studied in Rome (note that he is contemporary with Ambrose, Jerome, and Augustine), but was chiefly influenced by his friendship with Martin of Tours, with whom he spent some considerable time when he was returning

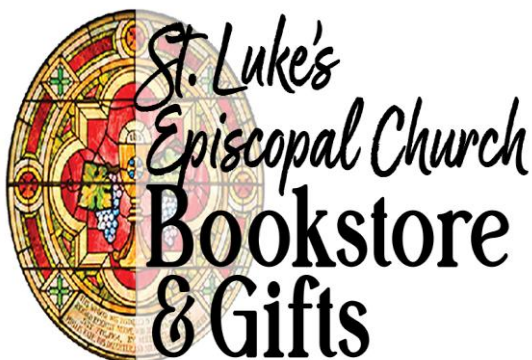
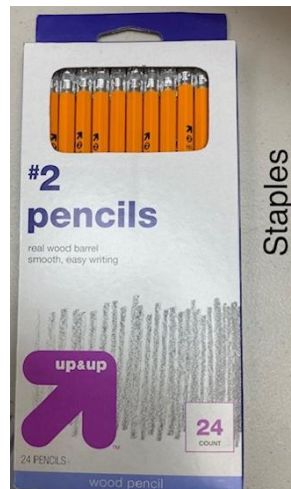
from Italy to Britain. It is probable that he named his headquarters in Galloway after Martin's foundation in Gall. Martin had a monastery known as LOCO TEIAC, a Latinized form of the Celtic LEUG TIGIAC. LEUG means "white, shining," and TIG means "house" (a shanty, or SHAN-TIG, is an old house). The suffix -AC means "little." Thus, Martin's monastery had a name which in Celtic means "little white house." At about the time of Martin's death in 397, Ninian built a church at Galloway, in southwest Scotland. It was built of stone and plastered white, an unusual construction in a land where almost all buildings were wood. He called it Candida Casa (White House) or Whithorn, presumably after Martin's foundation at Tours. Archaeologists have excavated and partially restored his church in this century. From his base at Galloway, Ninian preached throughout southern Scotland, south of the Grampian Mountains, and conducted preaching missions among the Picts of Scotland, as far north as the Moray Firth. He also preached in the Solway Plains and the Lake District of England. Like Patrick (a generation later) and Columba (a century and a half later), he was a principal agent in preserving the tradition of the old Romano-British Church and forming the character of Celtic Christianity. Some historians think that the number and extent of his conversions has been exaggerated, but throughout southern

Scotland there are many and widespread churches that bear his name, and have traditionally been assumed to be congregations originally founded by him.

Our information about him comes chiefly from Bede's History (Book 3, chapter 4), an anonymous eighth century account, and a 12th century account by Aelred. Aelred is writing 700 years after the event, and is for that reason rejected as untrustworthy by many critics. However, he claims to rely on an earlier account, "written by a barbarian." This suggests that he may have had an authentic record by a member of Ninian's community in Galloway.

O God, who by the preaching of your blessed servant and bishop Ninian caused the light of the Gospel to shine in the land of Britain: Grant, we pray, that having his life and labors in remembrance, we may show our thankfulness by following the example of his zeal and patience; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.
